Rail disruption Leeds-Manchester



There will be four weeks of disruption to weekday services in West Yorkshire.

The work is being carried out as part of the Transpennine Route Upgrade, a multi-billion pound programme to improve the route between Manchester, Huddersfield, Leeds and York.

Only weekday services are affected, from Mon 22 Apr until Fri 17 May. In particular weekday trains between Northallerton/ Thirsk/ York and Manchester airport will be replaced by buses for part of the journey.

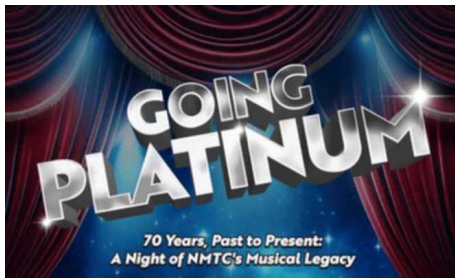
